Summary of Needs Assessment Findings:

The camera system was in dire need of upgrades. Most of the cameras for the district were not functional prior to the 2019-2020 school year. Work began on the upgrades in the fall and spring of that school year. The district continues to find gaps in areas of sight coverage.

The elementary entrance and Star building entrance have been upgraded to a keypad system. The elementary office has been reconfigured for maximum efficiency and security as of 08/2020. The district is working toward the upgrades to the entrance of the high school building.

COVID 19 measures have been put in place district-wide. TEA supplied the district with PPE as well as disinfectant from our janitorial company.
